He re-enlisted in to the Army in 1965 as a Optometry Officer, 2nd Lieutenant, then headed to Basset Army Hospital at Ft. Wainwright in Fairbanks, Alaska. He had many great hunting and fishing adventures during his tour in Alaska and was promoted Captain in 1967 then being honorably discharged in 1968.

Terry and Alice moved to Hermiston, Oregon with their young family in 1968 where he served many members of the community through his Optometry Practice. He also enjoyed being a member of the Hermiston Kiwanis Club for 30 years where he met many of his lifelong friends. Terry loved the outdoors and enjoyed hiking, hunting, fishing and camping trips with family and friends in their RV.

After retiring, Terry and Alice moved to the Oregon Coast in 1999. They loved

exploring the beautiful coast line, walking the beaches and searching for agates & other treasures including glass floats in Lincoln City. Terry also loved being a grandpa and left his grandkids with many happy memories.
